

From the Principal's Desk

The Season of Lent

The Season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday with the marking of ashes on everyone's foreheads – a sign that reminds us to live the way Jesus wants. It was the beginning of our preparation for Easter and a special time when we stop and think about how we can play our part in God's hope for a world that is just and peaceful. Through prayer, fasting and almsgiving we take the focus away from ourselves and instead focus on our relationship with God.

On Shrove Tuesday the students had the chance to offer up their commitments they have made during Lent. During our traditional burning ceremony Father Robert offered these to God by burning them, along with palms from last year's Palm Sunday Mass and some wheat from last year's harvest. During our Ash Wednesday service the ashes were used to mark everyone's forehead and we joined together to pray and sing the hymn "Out of Ashes".

Our Spiritual Ministers, Cooper and Latisha, then reminded us of the way in which we can contribute to Caritas' Project Compassion during the Lenten season and handed out a giving box to each family in the school. Caritas has as it's theme for 2019 to give Lent 100% in the name of hope! The students will be focusing on a project from a different country each week to raise their awareness of Caritas Australia's work overseas and highlight the ways in which the money they raise is used to give hope to the lives of others less fortunate than themselves.













Our Values Program – Fruit of the Spirit

The focus during the second set of three weeks of the term has been on Joy – another of the nine Fruit of the Spirit that are an integral part of our values system across the school. It has been very rewarding the hear the students refer to the Fruit of the Spirit in their reflections on aspects of each day. At the end of the Fremantle Dockers' visit to the school a few weeks ago, Angus Critch thanked the players and then presented them with a Fruit of the Spirit bookmark, highlighting the set of values students from Our Lady of Mt Carmel aspire to use in their daily interactions.

Staff Professional Development Day

While the students were enjoying their pupil free day, all of the staff had the opportunity to work with our school psychologist, Mrs Fiona Currans, and the Students with Disabilities Support Consultant from the Broome Diocese on a TeamTeach program. The program focuses on all staff working together collaboratively using a values driven approach to support all of the students in the school. Feedback from all of the staff was extremely positive and rewarding and we were able to work on planning that ensured as a staff we are always working toward the same goals, and in a cohesive fashion so that students are hearing the same messages across the school. A values driven approach in our school ultimately means we are using the Fruit of the Spirit as the basis of our approach to everything we do.
