





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Gospel

From the Principal's Desk

It was fitting that this week the Sunday Gospel reading was based on our school motto – *Love one another as I have loved you*. The students are aware that part of the school crest on their school shirt includes the symbol of the Sacred Heart of Jesus – a constant reminder to demonstrate love for one other, and for themselves. Last week, Mr Tony Critch (grandfather of Angus, Laney and Maggie), sent the school an excerpt from the handwritten diaries of Monsignor Hawes that recorded that the children of Our Lady of Mt Carmel School donated a statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to the church for the sum of seven pounds, ten shillings. This beautiful statue made of wood, sits on the left hand side of the church. When the last Presentation Sisters to teach at the school left Mullewa, they bequeathed a large image of the Sacred Heart that was to remain hanging in their original chapel. This image still hangs today in the school.

Mary – Rosary for Month of May

On Friday, 10th May, the students gathered together to pray the Rosary, especially for the month of May. The Year Three/Four class took on the role of practising and planning this Prayer Service. Students from Pre-Primary to Year Six all participated and followed along using their Rosary beads. The Year Three/Four students did a wonderful job of leading the school through the Rosary and reading the Joyful Mysteries. They had also spent a lot of time preparing the grotto in the front garden of the school with a new statue of Mary and some beautiful bunting with pictures and names for Mary. It was a special time for everyone to enjoy a sacred space and some silence during their praying.

Sacrament of Confirmation 2019

This Sunday, May 26th, seven students from Our Lady of Mt Carmel School will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. These students have been diligently preparing themselves to receive this Sacrament and they are becoming ready to be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit during the Rite of Confirmation in the Mass. Last Friday, Father Robert showed the students the special Oil of Chrism that will be used in the ceremony, and also spoke to them about the names of the Saints they have chosen as their Confirmation names. This Monday, Bishop Michael Morrissey will make a special visit to our school to visit the candidates and ensure they are well prepared to receive the Sacrament. Our candidates this year are Angus Critch, Cooper Messina, Taylah Pittman, Lachlan Rowe, Isabella Low, Laney Critch and Sofie Weir. They will be joined in this journey by their sponsors, family, the Parish and School community, and their classmates who will be receiving a special blessing in the ceremony. Families are welcome to attend the Mass to support the candidates and students from Year One to Six are also encouraged to come along and sing in the school choir.



Sacrament of Reconciliation

Our Year Three students will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation next Tuesday, 28th May, at 9:00am in Our Lady of Mt Carmel Church. The Year Four students will be attending the ceremony to support their classmates, along with family members. A simple morning tea will follow the ceremony in the front garden of the school.

Communio Week

Communio is a name given to a plan to help the needy people in our own Diocese of Geraldton. Communio Week in schools, takes place in second term and the school is currently collecting donations of toiletries and fleecy blankets. These will be used for the students to make care packs to give to Centacare in Geraldton for families in need. Thank you to those families who have already donated to this worthy cause.

School Cyclic Review

Towards the end of June, our school will be involved in a School Cyclic Review (SCR). The SCR process is intended to promote a culture of reflection, collaborative inquiry and shared responsibility for continuous improvement at both school and system levels. SRC is a collegial review *with* the school and *for* the school not *of* the school. The SCR provides an opportunity for a panel of educators, external to the school, to affirm, challenge and report on the improvement journey at the school. SCR focuses on the effectiveness of a school's engagement with self-review, the impact of self-review on school improvement and the future directions for the improvement of student outcomes that the school has identified. SCR occurs once in a

five-year period and contributes to the compliance of school re-registration regulations in this state. The SCR Panel will be visiting our school this term. As part of that process they will be meeting with the Leadership Team, a selection of staff, Parish Priest and nominees from the School Board and P&F group. At the conclusion of the SCR Panel visit, a report that comments on our school improvement processes and strategic direction will be written and forwarded to the school.

Oral History Presentations – Pat Mills, Kevin Merrit and Clem Keeffe

Last week the students from Years Three to Six walked down to the Mullewa Town Hall to listen to oral history presentations from three former residents of Mullewa – Pat Mills (great aunty of Flynn and Noah), Kevin Merrit and Clem Keeffe (great uncle of Riley and Patrick). Unfortunately, Clem is currently in hospital in Perth, but his son, Courtney, stood in for Clem and spoke beautifully about his father. The hall was filled with Mullewa residents and many ex-residents whom had travelled across from Geraldton for the morning, and the children were absolutely entranced and overcome with emotion about the stories they listened to. It was a truly magical morning for everyone and we really look forward to another event like this. A favourite story from the presentations involved Pat Mills having a race to school in her sulky pulled by her fat old pony, against Ken Keeffe on a much faster horse!


