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Our Lady of Mt Carmel

Our Lady of Mt Carmel is the title given to Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order of Priests. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mt Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel dedicated to the Blessed Virgin. Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centred on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named Saint Simon Stock. In Catholic tradition, the brown scapular is a sign of belonging to Mary, and also a pledge to trust in Mary and try to become more like her, especially by using her virtues of humility and devotion to prayer. The liturgical feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on 16 July. As this date regularly falls on the school holidays, we will be celebrating with a school Mass this Friday, 9th August, that will be prepared by the Year Three/Four class. **Please note that the Mass will be at 11:00am, rather than the usual time of 9:00am**.

Messages from the Principal's Desk

Fruit of the Holy Spirit

Our school community has been focusing on Patience as an important Fruit of the Holy Spirit during the first 3 weeks of term. The students have spent time reflecting on ways in which they demonstrate patience in their daily lives, such as allowing everyone to have their say during discussions, and acknowledging not everyone is as skilled as each other in their daily routines, and in their learning.

Staff Retreat

On our Pupil Free Day at the start of the term, our staff joined with the staff from St Mary's School, Northampton to participate in a Staff Retreat run by Father Robert and Mr Damien O'Malley, the Religious Education Consultant from CEO in Geraldton. The day was entitled "Sacred Spaces in the Mid-West" and focused on the role prayer can play in our lives, as well as the sacred places and spaces within our Church, and the Mass. A special part of the day included all staff walking together to experience a short pilgrimage on the life of Monsignor Hawes. Our town is blessed to have the Monsignor Hawes' Heritage Trail that includes the amazing work undertaken by Hawes in the Midwest and his particular devotion to the sacredness he included in his buildings.

Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment

Each year our Year Three and Year Five students participate in the annual Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment. Students from these year levels will complete their test this Friday morning, 9th August.

Leaders' Forum

Last week I spent a day at a Leaders' Forum in Perth for all principals from Catholic schools in Western Australia. This type of event was an opportunity for principals to explore Christ-centred leadership in Catholic schools as well network with colleagues from across the state. Aspects of the Forum included Governance within CEWA for 2020 and beyond, system updates on CEWA key projects such as the Child Safe Framework, Plenary Council 2020, Strategic Directions in CEWA 2019-2021 and an address by the new Executive Director of the National Catholic Education Commission, Jacinta Collins.

The trainers set the dogs to work and for a bit of fun had two of our students play tug of war with the dog, and attempt to run as fast as they could. All of the students really enjoyed the visit and were allowed to give the dogs a pat after their demonstration.









Digital Technology Consultant

In the last week of Term Three, our staff were fortunate to spend time with a consultant from the Catholic Education Office on Digital Technology and the use of resources and devices in the classroom. Michelle Lloyd made a special visit to our school to work on enhancing our use of iPads and setting up learning spaces with the use of technology. All staff had the opportunity to be upskilled in this use and it is pleasing to see students already having the benefit of Michelle's work in their learning in the first weeks of this term.

Outback Bloom Art Project

During the first week of this term, our Year Five/Six students again had the opportunity to participate in the Outback Bloom Art Project organised for us by the Mullewa District Office. The visiting artist leading the project was again, Helen Ansell, our talented local artist (and parent). Helen worked with the students on beautiful sketches and paintings of the students' favourite botanical plant from the Mullewa area. It was wonderful to see the affinity the students already had with this flora and fauna, due to work previously undertaken by Helen and the Outback Bloom Project. We look forward to viewing the students' work during the Outback Bloom Festival close to our Mullewa Wildflower Show and Mullewa District Agricultural Show.

Bendigo Bank Grant – School Vegetable Garden

Science Excursion to Grain Trial Site at Tenindewa

Last Wednesday afternoon, the Year Five/Six students participated in a Science Excursion organised by Mrs Tracey Messina, to the trial site run by the Geraldton Department of Agriculture and Food. The students were able to see a variety of different types of canola that had been planted according to particular variables and were able to investigate the ways these variables had affected their growth rate. This learning opportunity tied in well with the Year Five/Six Biology topic. A big thank you to Mrs Messina for organising the excursion for the students and to Miss Makeeli for assisting with travel. We are also very appreciative of the time taken by the agronomist, Marty, for the time he invested in preparing such an interesting learning experience for the students.
